
2022 Global Rights Index

Violations of Workers' Rights

The 2022 ITUC Global Rights Index depicts the world's worst countries for workers by rating 148 countries on a scale from 1-5+ based on the degree of respect for workers' rights, with 1 being the best rating and 5+ the worst rating.

Violations are recorded each year from April to March. Each country is analysed against a list of 97 indicators derived from ILO conventions and jurisprudence. The Index represents violations of workers' rights in law and practice.



Right to strike

87% of countries violated the right to strike.

Right to establish and join a trade union

77% of countries excluded workers from the right to establish or join a trade union.



Right to justice

66% of countries restricted access to justice for workers.



Right to trade union activities

74% of countries impeded the registration of unions.



Right to civil liberties

69 countries arrested or detained



Right to free speech and assembly

41% of countries restricted free speech and assembly.




Violent attacks on workers

Trade unionists were murdered in 13 countries: Bangladesh, Colombia, Ecuador, Eswatini, Guatemala, Haiti, India, Iraq, Italy, Lesotho, Myanmar, the Philippines and South Africa.
